Jodi Clark

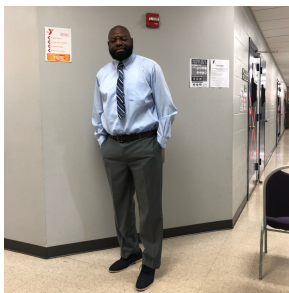
